POSITION SNAPSHOT

The Project Accountant will take responsibility for management of the financial systems for the Institute's international programs for certain projects and working groups.

This role oversees an operational budget of approximately \$10m providing financial support to various project managers.

KEY RESPONSIBILITY AREAS

4.	Consolidate and reconcile accounting information from MBC and CIH database.
5.	Update, reconcile and analyse internal project budget versus actual reports on monthly basis and advise Project Managers if any potential issues or risks need to be addressed.
6.	Assist with the preparation of projects for external financial audits and liaise with auditors.
7.	Support Project Managers and Working Group Heads in preparation of new budget proposals and liaise with Business Development and donors in relation to project budgets and financial reporting requirements.


